

Calhoun Campground Rules

- A person shall not operate a motor vehicle except on roads and parking lots constructed for the operation of licensed vehicles. Unlicensed vehicles shall not be operated in the park or campground. Golf carts that belong to registered campers may be used in the campground.
- A person shall not engage in any violent, abusive, loud, boisterous, profane, obscene, or otherwise disorderly conduct, or disturb or annoy others. Law enforcement being called to a campsite by the Park Staff due to any of the above activities will result in immediate removal from the campground with no refund.
- A person shall not dump, place, throw, or leave litter on the grounds or waters, except in containers provided.
- A person must keep their dogs or other animals under immediate control on a leash not exceeding 6 feet in length in the campground. Campers are expected to clean up after their pets and secure them in an enclosed vehicle or tent at night. Excessive barking or aggressive behavior will not be tolerated. Campers may be fined and/or removed from the campground with no refund if they repeatedly violate the campground pet policy.
- A person must not possess glass containers on or in the river.
- A person shall not destroy, damage, affix using tools, or remove city property, trees, shrubs, wildflowers, grasses or vegetation in Calhoun Campground. Campsite trees or shrubs may be used to temporarily hang items such as hammocks, shade sails or laundry lines, but only with the permission of the Park Staff.
- A person must keep all campfires in designated fire pits provided or grills approved by Park Staff, and may not be left unattended. Burning trash and large fires are strictly prohibited. Please do not throw small items such as cans, bottles or bottle caps into the fire rings, they are very difficult to remove. Fires should be completely extinguished before leaving.
- All persons should observe campground Quiet Time, which is between the hours of 10:00pm and 8:00am. All visitors not registered with a campsite must leave the campground by 10:00pm.
- A person shall not wash their dishes in the bathrooms or near drinking water areas. Michigan State Department of Health prohibits this.
- A person shall abide by all Beaverton City Park Ordinances upon entering Calhoun Campground and all other City Parks.
- Each campsite may be used by only one family or not more than four unrelated persons. Campers not part of a single family must be at least 18 years old to register or occupy a campsite unless part of a chaperoned group. (i.e. scouts, cyclists, etc.).

Violation of these rules or any Beaverton City Park ordinance (Title III Parks and Public Grounds, Chapter 31, Parks-General Regulations), will be grounds for removal from the campground without a refund.
